Statewide and nationally, UVA Health is synonymous with exceptional care and research.

- For the seventh year in a row, UVA Health University Medical Center topped the *U.S. News & World Report* ranking of Virginia’s hospitals— #2 overall with the #1 children’s hospital.
- UVA Health Children’s is nationally ranked in six children’s specialties: Pediatric Cardiology, Heart Surgery, Neonatology, Gastroenterology & G.I. Surgery, Pulmonology & Lung Surgery, Neurology & Neurosurgery, and Diabetes & Endocrinology.
- UVA Cancer Center is the first in Virginia (and one of only 54 nationally) to achieve the National Cancer Institute’s Comprehensive Cancer Center designation.
- *Newsweek* selected University Medical Center as the #1 cancer hospital in Virginia and #50 in the United States on its “America’s Best Cancer Hospitals 2023” list.
- *Becker’s Hospital Review* named UVA Health University Medical Center to its 2023 list of “Great Hospitals in America” based on its reputation for superior care, research, and education.

SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

UVA School of Medicine is ranked No. 1 statewide for medical research and primary care (30th and 35th in the nation, respectively), according to *U.S. News & World Report 2023*. Its stellar reputation is based on high ratings in research, primary care, and public service. UVA offers MD, master’s and PhD degrees. Graduate MD students choose from nearly 70 specialties. PhD options include a biomedical sciences degree (BIMS); biochemistry; molecular biology and genetics; biomedical engineering; microbiology, immunology, and infectious diseases; molecular cell and developmental biology; and molecular medicine. Our faculty-student ratio of 2.1:1 enables highly personalized training from world-class clinicians and scientists.

SCHOOL OF NURSING

UVA School of Nursing is consistently ranked among the top 2% of American nursing schools. *U.S. News & World Report 2023-24* distinctions include “Best Nursing Schools: Doctor of Nursing Practice” and “Best Nursing Schools: Master’s.*” UVA’s graduate nursing programs remain Virginia’s best. Every undergraduate and graduate student has opportunities to conduct original research, work in collaboration with a faculty nurse scientist, and study and serve abroad. Hybrid and executive format programs offer flexible scheduling for aspiring and veteran professionals.
